

Transnational education

• Transnational education (TNE) is education delivered in a country other than the country in which the awarding institution is based, e.g. students based in country Y studying for a degree from a university in country Z. UK HE TNE refers to UK degree programmes delivered outside of the UK (Universities UK, 2021).






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








Virtual Seminar Evaluation (79)
